The activity can be stressful for cetaceans, whether you're in a kayak, a sailboat, a Zodiac or a cruise ship

A company that is mindful of the animals' welfare will reduce its speed near whales and maintain a respectful distance



WARNING!

It is against the law to approach belugas in a watercraft

Belugas must be observed from shore



CHOOSING A TYPE OF BOAT

The experience can vary depending on the size of the watercraft

A smaller boat gives the impression that you are closer to the water

A larger boat will be more stable and may be more practical for photo-taking
